When to pick.

THERE ARE OVER 100 CROPS—60 varieties of apples, 10 types of peaches, and tons of other goodies. They ripen at different times from June through November. What's ripe now? Got any Honeycrisp? How can I keep track?



YOU CAN SIGN UP FREE FOR FRESH CROP ALERTS. We'll email you when crops are ready. You won't miss your favorite local foods.

ISN'T THERE A CALENDAR? Sure, see our web site. But, remember: If you want to make Mother Nature laugh, tell her your plans.

BETTER TO STAY HUMBLE AND GET CROP ALERTS. They're free. They're fun. And they are the best way to keep up with reality.

CROPS EBB AND FLOW. That's life on a small farm, where the season is short

and the weather is weird. And that's why a whole mess of local food lovers have already subscribed to Crop Alerts.

How to pick.

DO ask the stand worker which crops are ready to pick. There is variation even among varieties of the same fruits and vegetables. For example, yellow peaches versus white peaches, and beefsteak versus heirloom tomatoes.

DO NOT bite a piece of fruit then toss it on the ground. If you've picked before it is ripe, don't panic. A peach will be ripe in a few days and an apple will continue to sweeten. Take it home and eat it... or give it to your neighbor!

DO ask for picking tools and return them when done. Some items are best picked with clippers (eggplant), big loppers (sprouts), or those cool picking sticks (apples).

DO look for these ribbons in the Vintage Orchard:

ORANGE = McIntosh

YELLOW = Cortland


BLUE = Rome/Red Delicious

RED = Northern Spy

DO pick apples with 2 hands. Before you pick an apple, steady the branch and the nearby apples with one hand, then gently twist with your picking hand. If you just grab and yank, other apples will fall and cause a chain reaction below. Imagine 500 people knocking a few apples off each time. Heartbreaking waste.



The whole farm.

Welcome to The 'Creek. Feel free to hike around and have a picnic. Drive carefully. Look out for kids, pets, tractors, and potholes. It is a working farm and there are lots of  going around. Speed limit = slow.

This map shows the visitor roads (**yellow**) and work roads (gray with red bars **/////**). Please keep your vehicle traffic on the visitor roads. You can walk along the work roads, but please stay clear of the work zones (**orange**).

If you want to know when crops will be ripe, ask about Fresh Crop Alerts.

There are 60 types of apples here in the Dwarf Orchard.

They ripen at different times, so please ask at the farm stand which varieties are ready to pick. We will circle them on your map.

If you pick an apple, take it home.

Each one is precious. It took a long time to grow. Do not take a bite and throw it on the ground! Way too mean! How would you like to be bitten and thrown away?

Reserved = Please do not pick these rows.

It is very hard to tell when these special varieties are ready to pick. We'll pick them when ripe, and you can get them down at the stand.
